

## HSE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

The need for a Documented Systematic Approach to HSE Management has been a key legal requirement for all businesses in the UK and Europe for many years. The expected simple approach is described in UK Health and Safety Executive (HSE) guidelines popularly known as ‘HS(G)65’.

Post Piper Alpha it became a requirement for offshore facilities too. The E&P Forum (now the Oil and Gas Producer Association (OGP)) provided their “Guidelines to HSE Management Systems” in 1995. Companies will typically have a Corporate HSE Management System and then appropriate Operating Unit, Departmental and Site HSE Management Systems.

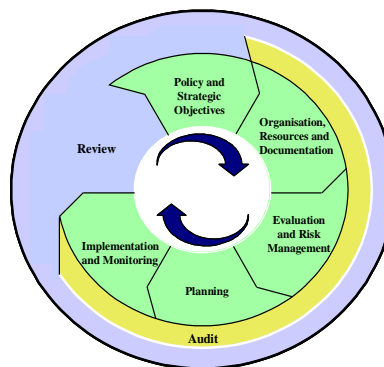

**HSE MS ‘Gap Analysis’:** Review and assessment of HSE MS Overview or System against Legal, International, or Industry Standards with Recommended Improvement Action Plan.

**HSE Standards, Procedures and Guidelines:** Formulation of Standards, Procedures and Guidelines on the principles and application of the Key Operational Elements of Oil Industry HSE Management Systems e.g.

Risk Identification and Assessment	Hazardous Operations
Incident Investigation	HSE Planning
Safe Work Management (incl. PTW)	Performance Monitoring
Emergency Reponse / Oil Spill	Occupational Health
Contractor HSE Management	Environmental Management
Auditing	Competence & Training
Workforce Involvement	Marine / Aviation Operations

**Audits and Reviews:** Audits are used to confirm the system is being implemented and is working as intended. Reviews aim to assess the ongoing appropriateness of the system

**Management Reviews:** Management Reviews are facilitated processes where the Leadership Team assess the ongoing appropriateness of the System
